

HAMPTON FIRST BAPTIST CHURCH **CLOTHES & HOUSEHOLD ANNUAL REPORT FOR 2019**

The Clothes & Household ministry had another blessed year of helping others. Thanks to all who have been involved. A special thanks go to the volunteer workers, those people who gave monetary gifts, clothing and household donations, the WMU organization, our preacher, Sheila, Danny and our church custodian. Thanks to all involved. You did a great job! Here's the breakdown of how we helped people in 2019: **QUARTERS** Ist - 4TH; TOTAL OPEN DAY CLIENTS - 1562; SPECIAL NEEDS - 154 + 2990 Bags; SPECIAL ASSISTANCE - 167

MEANING OF CATEGORIES: Open Day Clients are individuals receiving clothes on open days. Special Needs include victims of burn outs, ill or disabled, victims of poverty, nursing home clients, homeless people, people in jail, or referrals. This ministry works in partnership with The Salvation Army, Cancer Thrift Store in Beaufort, DSS, Council of Aging, schools, nursing homes, assistance living facilities, foster parents, jail ministry, Hospice, and local churches. In addition to *154 individuals being helped under Special Needs, 2990 bags of clothes and household items were given to charity groups. Therefore, we know many additional people received help from us. Special Assistance covers people in emergencies or needs assistance in satisfying their clothing or household needs at a given time. On October 12, 2019 we had a Special Bible Study after Open Day hours. We had 48 people to stay for Bible Study after serving refreshments to all people there at II a.m. Emerson Wiles lead in Bible study and Bibles with the Plan of Salvation were given to all who needed them. This year five new volunteers joined us. However, two of those are students and work temporarily. Bobbie Swofford, a former worker died this year too. A plaque in her memory has been placed among others.
