Covid-19 and Love

Could these many months of Covid-19 be a time to think...pray...consider...evaluate ourselves as Christ's followers? And should we not do the same for the church we attend that belongs to Him? I believe the Lord would have us to use this pause, this interruption in our usual activity to think, pray, consider and evaluate who we are and what we do as followers of Jesus and as congregations.

Look through the Gospels. Everywhere you turn you find Jesus showing compassion to people. He fed the hungry. He healed the sick. He welcomed those despised by others. Read the story of Jesus and Zacchaeus in Luke 19:1-10. The crowd thought very little of Zacchaeus. They were quite perturbed that Jesus would invite Himself to stay at the home of a sinner. "Zacchaeus, come down immediately. I must stay at your house today." I love that invitation! Jesus loved the sinner Zacchaeus. Jesus saw the hunger Zacchaeus had to know Jesus. He showed love, compassion, grace and mercy to Zacchaeus. And it wasn't just words. He showed it with His presence, time, choices (anyone would have been honored to host Jesus for lunch) and with bringing salvation to this seeker. Jesus went out of His way to reach this one.

As followers of Jesus we are to be like and act like Him (we can only do this in the power of His Holy Spirit). Are we doing this? Are we reaching out to those not like us who are in our community? Or do we save all our caring only for fellow church members? Are we examples of compassion, love, grace and mercy? What needs to be adjusted in our thinking and acting to become more like Jesus? Think about it. Pray about it.

Some many miles from here a family's porch was damaged and became unsafe. They were not church-goers and also could not repair their porch. Members of a nearby church showed up in their yard with tools and lumber. "Would it be alright if we helped you with this porch? We can fix it for free." Not only that family, but other families in the neighborhood were impacted by this act of kindness and caring. It opened the door to a readiness to hear the Gospel. This is one example of "love your neighbor."

Consider how the Lord can use you to love your neighbors that have not ever been to your church. Acts of compassion and kindness may open the door so they, too, can experience the love of Christ. And that's what we are here for.



Friday – Sunday for \$300 If you have more than 25 people the cost would increase.


