There are persons all around us who find it hard to believe that there is a God who loves them. They may or may not have heard much about Jesus. You may know someone who seems to fit this description. What can we do as individuals and as churches to minister to them?

God's plan for them to find out about His love is simple. He wants them to see His love being lived out in believer's lives. Followers of Jesus are to love each other. We are commanded to love those who are not in our circle of close friends. Love those who do not especially love us.

And Jesus makes it very clear that we are to love our enemies. The Holy Spirit helps us with this. He produces the spiritual fruit of love in the believer's life as we are yielded to His control. He enables us to love other believers, and, to love those who have not yet believed.

Christians and churches have to be very intentional about loving others who are around us but not in our circles of relationships. We have to prayerfully listen for God's guidance about His plans about how He would specifically use us to minister to others with the love of Christ. As we do, we realize expressing this love has to be relational. Writing a check to help strangers does not complete the outreach of God's love to a lost person's heart. To whom does God want you to personally express love in action? It could be children in the local elementary school that needs Reading Buddies or a Good News Club. It could be lonely and needy senior adults in our community. It might even be a neighbor!

As we love others with this godly love, it is real-life evidence that there is a God who loves people. It is a relational and practical love—not just words we say. My prayer for myself, for you, and for each church in our association, is that we would be fully surrendered to God and let God live out His love through us. As we do, more individuals will realize there is a God who loves them.



You arrive in a strange place, with little knowledge of the local language. You don't even know where the stores are. The day after you arrive, you start work before the sun has even risen. The work is hard, and it's an uncomfortable situation, but this is the only way to lift your family out of poverty and make sure your kids can go to school. What I've just described is the experience of the thousands of farm workers who arrive in our area every year to plant, tend, and harvest the crops we consume. We have the opportunity to help them with practical needs, including through the health kits our wMu groups provide. We also have an opportunity to share with them the love God has shown us in Christ. As we enter the time of year when many workers will be returning to our area, would you join me in praying for three things? First, pray that we would be able to locate as many workers as possible. Second, pray that we would be effective at meeting as many needs as possible. Third, pray that as many people as possible would understand the Gospel and respond in faith to God's call on their lives. As always, thank you for your prayers and sup-
