You never know when you will encounter an "oinker!" I went to Bethea Baptist Retirement Center to visit my ninety-year-old mother, June, who resides there. At the entrance I met a most unusual welcoming committee: this big pig! The photo doesn't do him (or her) justice. The pig seemed full-grown, and

not that interested in me. But I was afraid of getting too near the beast. So I stood close to the sign and zoomed in for the photo. I have evidence that all kinds are welcome at our South Carolina Baptist ministry to seniors.

This got me to thinking about several things. • You never know who you will run into. What I may think is a random encounter may not be one at all. The Lord uses people and situations to get our attention. Or something someone says may stay with you and impact your life. For example, when I was a stubborn teen and not close to the Lord, a big stranger asked me if I was a Christian. I said "Yeh," but, with little enthusiasm. His one word reply has stuck with me for half a century. He replied, "Really?" I have thought about that encounter many times. And the reverse can happen. At any time, the Lord may want to use you to plant a thought in someone else's heart. Look for those opportunities where God can use you!

- 2. You never know who may show up at your church. A stranger might just be brave enough to visit. It does take courage to go to a place that is strange to you. And a few seconds upon their arrival, they begin to sense if they are welcome or not. This is something you and fellow church members can prepare for. It is more important to relate well and genuinely to the visitor than most else you would do that Sunday. Don't be the "oinker" who ignores the visitor!
- 3. You never know what surprises the Lord will allow into your life. We don't know what is coming in 2021. We do know that the Lord uses people and situations to accomplish His purposes in and for our lives, and for others. May we be more sensitive to the Spirit's leading, and be listening to Him more. Then our response to the surprises may glorify Him and be part of furthering His Kingdom.


