Questions

Karen was alone at home. A massive stroke left her helpless on her kitchen floor. Help came in time. I was with her husband, David, at the hospital that evening. Deacon David prayed aloud, "Lord, what are you telling me? What are you teaching me through this experience?" This happened about two decades ago, but I remember it distinctly. In the heat of a devastating crisis, here was a godly deacon asking the Lord the right kind of questions. I learned from Deacon David that day.

What are our questions in regards to the Covid-19 pandemic crisis? On what or on whom are we focused? What are we asking God? Anybody can ask, "Why?" Anybody can ask, "Why me?" A follower of Jesus, though, can ask questions that are deeper and higher, as did my deacon friend.

We can and should pray with understanding that God is sovereign, and that He is working through all things for the good of those who are called according to His purpose. Also, we understand that He is working to draw the lost to Jesus and to draw the saved closer to Himself.

I've been listening to church leaders from various parts of South Carolina as they shared regarding the current crisis. Many of them respond like Deacon David. "Lord, how do You want me to adjust my life to fit in with what You are doing?" "How can we be a church on mission during this crisis?" "Whom should we help?" "Lord, I need to be aware of what You are telling us about worship, faith, fellowship, and loving You and our neighbors more than before the crisis." "What are You telling us about our priorities?" "What do You want changed in me, and what do You want changed in Your church?" "What should be changed so that You would be glorified more in our lives?" "What should be changed so that You would be glorified more in the ministries that You have entrusted to us?

My prayer is that leaders and folks in our churches would be earnestly asking the Lord the right kind of questions. May this be a crisis time that brings us closer to each other, closer to the Lord, and closer to being the followers who desire what He desires.

As life slowly begins to return to a semblance of normality, I'm thankful for the ministry opportunities the Lord has given me over the past couple of months. Even as in-person services in Hampton have not taken place, we have continued to minister to one another over the Internet. I've also had the opportunity to minister in-person at various locations on farms. Several times, we've met outside, standing in a circle on the grass. In the midst of the uncertainty, many people are hungry to hear God's Word. As I was distributing health kits to a recently-arrived group of farm workers this week, one of them came outside just as I was about to leave. He saw the New Testaments I had given the others and said to me, "Do you have a New Testament for me? I don't care about the other stuff. Please just give me a New Testament." Of course, I gave him both a New Testament and a health kit! Just like this man, many more are hungry to receive the Word of God during this time. Thank you for making it possible for me to take the Gospel to them.
