It is a privilege to serve the Lord Jesus with you! We can accomplish more together than we can separately. This year we went through a visioning process as a group of concerned leaders. One result was a new Association Vision Statement: The Allendale-Hampton Baptist Association exists to assist churches to evangelize the lost, disciple the saints, and facilitate mission endeavors.

Assist Churches to Evangelize the Lost

In evangelism, we sought to prepare more counselors for the 2022 Men's Wild Game Banquet. We offered training times and had a good response. We had materials ready for counseling during the invitation and to give to men as they responded. We have been doing this for several years.

I participated in the Hampton County Citizens for Active Restoration Community Field Day on May 14, 2022, where our association utilized the Good News Trailer. I planned and purchased everything needed to encourage folks to stop by so I could invite them to our local Vacation Bible Schools. The bean bag games and the giveaways did invite traffic! I offered brochures that gave the morning worship time, address, and a contact person for each of our churches. The brochure that was most widely received listed the Vacation



Bible Schools of which I had information, and other community events put on by our churches. I gave away good books by Christian authors and had a few opportunities to witness. The above photo shows our AHBA table at the Community Field Day.

Assist Churches to Disciple the Saints

In discipling the saints, our pastor small group book discussions modeled, in part, a small group discipleship process. Also, we have scheduled a world-wide leader in discipling others, Dr. Richard Blackaby, to lead a conference on Monday, October 10, 2022 from 11:30 AM to 2:30 PM at Camp Jackson. The cost is only twenty dollars. Richard Blackaby has been with us before and the experience was very helpful.

Facilitate Mission Endeavors

I have been involved in assisting mission endeavors by coordinating church involvement in feeding BRICK teams. Thank you to the churches who helped in this! We are also ready to assist churches who want to use the Good News Trailer for outreach. Everything on the trailer was new. I encourage you to reserve the Good News Trailer and use it to reach out to your community or one that is nearby. This year I served as Unit Leader (Blue Hat) on a SC Disaster Relief effort in Horsham, Pennsylvania with a chain-saw team. I joined with the same disaster relief unit and served people after the tornadoes went through Allendale. I encouraged one pastor to complete SCDR Unit Leader training. This enabled us to serve as part of an active unit. Thank you for the opportunity to serve the Lord with you as your director of missions,
